

GREETING CARDS WITH BUTTONS



WHAT YOU WILL NEED

Old or new greeting cards
Spare envelopes in varying sizes
Light cardboard, used file folders

Light cardboard, used file folders, or card stock to protect the cards during mailing.

Strong scissors for cutting the cardboard Sharp scissors for cutting the cards and decorations

A collection of colorful buttons, mostly sew through A few beads

Low temp glue sticks and Glue Sticks for paper Glue gun

Small cord, ribbon, lace, rickrack, or fabric scraps Optional – glitter glue

THE GLUE

Always use a low temperature glue gun and sticks. This glue can be easily pulled off buttons to rearrange, or to salvage the button for another project.





NEW CARDS


If using new cards, you will focus on decorating the front, then cutting a cardboard protective sheet to slip in the mailing envelope to protect the front of your card.

DECORATING USED CARDS

- ENVELOPE -- Select an envelope for the card you will create. Choose one that is larger than the image you have. If you don't have a spare envelope that is large enough, you can make your own envelopes to hold your creation.
- 2. INTERIOR SENTIMENT -- As you receive cards, record or save any sentiments in the cards for inspiration when you create your own cards. For instance, here is one of my favorites that I have kept to use again and again.
- 3. CARD PROTECTORS A card with buttons on the front will need a protector so that the buttons don't tear through the envelope in the mail. I use colorful used file folders, and cut the protectors with rounded corners to be ½' smaller than the finished card in height and width. The smaller size and


rounded corners make it easy to slip the protector into the envelop.

- a. Select a color of cardstock for your protector.
- b. Trace around your card, and then cut inside the lines by 1/4", cutting rounded corners.
- Keep the cardstock with the card, and place it on top of the card in the envelope to protect the buttons during mailing.
- 4. CARD COVERS -- You can create special cards of your own by painting or drawing



your own card, or by using pictures cut from cards you have received.
