PUZZLE ORNAMENTS

NBS encourages "no harm" button jewelry and crafting.
Buttons and buckles will not be damaged in the creative process.

SUPPLIES FOR RUDOLPH

- 5 or 8 puzzle pieces
- 2 or 4 googly eyes or markers/paints for eyes
- One red button, bead or bit for a red nose
(if it's not Rudolph, then a black button)
- Ribbon for hanging
- Glue

SUPPLIES FOR THE SNOWFLAKE

- 6 puzzle pieces
- Ribbon for hanging
- 2 flat white medium or large buttons
- 2 small buttons
- Glue

SNOWFLAKE (any color!)

1. Lay six puzzle pieces out in a snowflake pattern.
2. Lay a flat medium or large white button on the center to be sure each puzzle piece goes under your center button. Lift the button up.
3. Put a dab of glue on the center tip of each puzzle piece.
4. Set the flat button back down so that each piece glues itself to the button. Let the glue dry all the way.
5. Turn the snowflake over.
6. Cut a ribbon or string into a 6" length. Glue both ends of the ribbon onto the snowflake center.
7. Put glue on the center tip of each puzzle piece and glue the second flat button down to cover the ornament back.
8. For the last step, glue a small button in the center of each side!

RUDOLPH THE RED-NOSED REINDEER

- A. Lay two puzzle pieces on a flat surface, with a tab pointing away from you for the farthest piece and a tab pointing towards you on the closest piece.
- B. Put glue on the tips of two puzzle pieces, and glue them at angles to be the antlers.
- C. Put glue on another puzzle piece to be the head with 'ears' on each side. Glue this head piece in the middle of both bottom pieces from 'A'. Let the glue dry.
- D. Draw eyes, or glue on eye; and glue on a bead or button for the nose.
- E. Turn your ornament over and glue a ribbon or string to hold your ornament.
- F. (optional) If you want your ornament to be the same on both sides, now add the 3 puzzle pieces, nose and eyes.
